

Marker Committee Report – February 28, 2018

Dave Wilhelm's focus for 2019 includes 3 items about the geological markers

- finish the Minnehaha Falls marker
- develop a plan and prioritize marker installation/repair for geological markers based on recent marker survey
- Continue developing a GSM marker database and survey the markers in 2019

The Geological Marker Committee has been operating for about 5 years. We have arrived at step 3 of our 6-step plan:

- 1. Find the existing markers, photograph them and get GPS coordinates.
- 2. Build/modify the database/home page to allow people easy access
- 3. Publicize to GSM, to state agencies, tourism, special groups, State Fair, state parks
- 4. Consider what future markers will look like? (traditional stone base and slanting bronze tablet, Split Rock Lighthouse, virtual, "lollipop", Keewanau) Who will we work with? (funding, logistical support, publicizing, etc.)
- 5. Plan and prioritize installing the missing markers; also new sites/subjects.
- 6. Recordkeeping to track status of all geological markers.

Recent work has focused on Step 3 – collaborating with other agencies in the state. In the past year, we have contacted the following:

- 1. Minnesota Geological Survey (Harvey and Rich) to create a brochure about the markers for distribution at the 2018 State Fair
- 2. Minnesota Historical Society (Todd Mahon) to talk about where they get their markers made (sewahstudios.com), the need to erect a marker at the Beaver Creek Visitor Center (SW Minnesota), and ideas for collaborating.
- 3. DNR (Veronica Jaralambides) to talk about collaborating
- 4. DOT (Brett Stark in Brainerd) to talk about moving a marker (Portsmouth Mine in Crosby) so DOT can install a tunnel under the highway. Requested "Geological Marker ahead" signs for the highway.
- 5. GSM had a booth at the Minnesota Earth Science Teachers Association annual conference. Next year, distribute the marker brochure. GSM has been present at the conference several years, thanks to Theresa.
- 6. Planned additional contacts Minnesota tourism, newspapers, geology teachers
- 7. State Fair from now on, distribute Geological Markers brochure at every State Fair

Questions:

- 1. What changes are planned for the database and accessing it?
- 2. Who will install the markers?

- 3. What will be the impact on GSM? Many people join GSM for the lectures and field trips. Some don't like driving around the state. Are we building the network for people who don't currently belong to GSM? Will we be able to attract new people to carry this forward?
- 4. Where will the money come from?
